At the end of June, we saw our first Peak Alert of the Summer. We were very pleased with the results and the success of your efforts. While we won't know the exact amount until next year, we tentatively estimate that we saved as much as \$50,000 in future energy expense. These savings are transferred to all RMU customers in the form of controlled energy cost.

As a thank you to our program participants, we raffled off four \$200 utility vouchers. The winners were chosen at random from the list of customers who have signed up to receive our Peak Alert texts. Parker's Saucy Meatballs

### Meatballs:

1 lb. Ground Beef 1/2 c. Dry Bread Crumbs 1/4 c. Milk 3/4 tsp. Salt 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce 1/4 tsp. Pepper 1 small onion, chopped 1 egg

Mix all ingredients and shape into 1 1/2" meatballs. Bake uncovered in 400° oven for 20-25 minutes OR pan fry over medium heat until brown, approximately 20 minutes

#### Sauce:

1/3 c. Milk 1/8 tsp. Ground Nutmeg 1 can Cream of Chicken Soup 1/2 c. Sour Cream

Combine milk, nutmeg, and soup. Place cooked meatballs in large skillet. Pour sauce over meatballs and simmer for 15 minutes, covered. Stir in sour cream and heat through.

- Electric and/or Water Deposits
- Past Due Electric and/or Water Bills
- Excessive Water Bill due to a leak on the customers side of the meter
- Repair of Water or Electric Service Lines on customer property
- Uncollectible accounts, where needed to reestablish RMU Utility Service

RMU collects, on a voluntary basis, donations for the "Helping Hand" program with 100% of your donations returned to the Rolla Community through the GRACE (Greater Rolla Area Charitable Enterprises) organization.
